## General outline for manuscript submission to YIJ Journal

- Abstract should be typed with single spacing. The manuscript should be typed with 1.5 spacing, single column and font size 12 on A4 paper not exceeding 12 pages, aligned as Justified. Include line numbers in all pages. In general, the contents should contain of Abstract, Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgement and References. Include page number to all pages at bottom right.
- 2. Manuscripts will be reviewed by the Editorial Board and decisions regarding the publication of a manuscript will be based on the Board's recommendations.
- 3. This template gives formatting guidelines for authors preparing papers for publication in Young Inventors Journal. The authors must follow the instructions given in the document for the papers to be published.
- 4. Margin of the paper should be 2.5 cm for all top, bottom, left and right.
- 5. All the chemical formulas should be written appropriately. For example:
